

On June 19, 1985, Norway issued a stamp which pictured the great violinist, Ole B. Bull, who was widely acclaimed for performances of his own compositions in a light virtuoso style and of arrangements of Norwegian folk tunes.

Ole Bornemann Bull was born on Feb. 5, 1810, at Bergen, Norway. He was mainly self-taught and at the age of nine became a member of the Bergen orchestra. In 1831 he went to Paris where he set himself the aim of emulating Niccolo Paganini. His career as a virtuoso violinist began in 1832 when he gave a concert in Paris assisted by Chopin. Between 1843 and 1879 he made five visits to the United States and eventually spent each summer in America and winter in Norway. In 1850 he established a Norse theatre at Bergen and two years later attempted to establish a Norwegian colony in Pennsylvania but had been deceived by land titles and lost a fortune. Bull's violin playing was remarkable for its chord effects which he achieved by using an almost flat bridge and a heavy and unusually long bow. He died at Lyso, near Bergen, on Aug. 17, 1880.

Bro. Bull's home Lodge is not known but he was recorded as a visitor to St. Cecile Lodge No. 568 of New York City in March 1868 and the Lodge of St. Andrew in Massachusetts. His business manager in this country was Fred Widdows, Past Master of Clinton Lodge No. 453, New York. On Oct. 30, 1845, Bro. Bull gave a concert for the Masonic Hall and Asylum Fund of the Grand Lodge of New York which netted \$1,400.

INDEPENDENCE_ROCK

Independence Rock, also known as "The Register of the Plains" - The Great Record of the Desert is located on the Sweetwater River midway between Casper, Wyo., on the north and Rawlings, Wyo., on the south. Thousands of names are inscribed on its granite face; Bonneville, Fremont, Father DeSmet and Brigham Young are among some of the illustrious men in history who have carved their names as they stopped to rest. The Rock was known and named before 1830 by hunters, trappers and adventurers.

On July 4, 1862, a wagon train headed for Washington and Oregon encamped on this spot. Out of this wagon train approximately 20 Masons, who could mutually vouch for each other, traversed to the top of the Rock to hold the first tyled Masonic Communication in what is now Wyoming. The Worshipful Master was Asa L. Brown who later became M.W. Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Washington Territory in 1864.


Alfred J. Mokler, Grand Historian (1922-1952) instigated the first commemorative communication held at Independence Rock - July 4, 1920. Aug. 27, 1939, the Grand Lodge of Wyoming passed a Standing Resolution stating that an anniversary communication should be held every 10 years. This was accordingly done every ten years, with the exception of 1960, which was postponed until 1962 to commemorate 100 years.

In keeping with this plan, as well as helping to celebrate Wyoming's Statehood Centennial, the Grand Master of Wyoming, Earl Christensen, again celebrated this anniversary. He led four wagon trains on July 3, 1990, to this site where they circled. There was evening entertainment at that site in the vein of 1890's for Masons, their family and friends. The following noontime Grand Lodge opened for a short meeting and then closed to hear an address delivered by Rex R. Hutchens, P.M., of Tucson, Arizona, an instructor in Philosophy at Pima Community College, Tucson. Except for the tyled meeting, Masons and non-masons alike participated in all the activities.

Bro. Dale Kinley, Member No. 423 of Escondido, CA, and Sheridan, WY, a personal friend of the Grand Master who led the ceremonies, participated in the event as one of the 1500 to 2000 attendees and 500 Masons who were able to climb the 100 yards, identifying themselves as Masons to the Tyler at the base of the Rock and following the rope up. 
also caused a special cachet and cancellation to be created for the day. He commissioned a Wyoming artist and the resulting cover is shown here. Only 500 of these were prepared and many of them have been sold. Those which are left are available at a cost of \$3.00 ea. (+ #10 SASE) from:






MSC_OF_NY_COVERS

SURINAM LODGE STAMP

David Yellin (1864-1941), professor at the University of Jerusalem who was a member of Lodge "Har-Zion" (Mount Zion) having been initiated in Salomen Quarries in Jerusalem and, as far as I can ascertain, was at one time Grand Master of the National Grand Lodge of Israel (Palestine) which existed until the consecration in 1953 of the Grand Lodge of the State of Israel.

"LIST OF STAMPS ON MASONRY"

Recently your editor received a request in the mail which stated simply "Please send me a list of stamps on the topic of Masonry". I thought long and hard about what to do in this instance - do I forget it as too long a task to answer for the value attained or do I compose an answer which might be used for others posing the same question. My response is provided here for your use if the occasion requires.

Dear Sir,

Please accept my apologies for the delay in response to your letter of June 16 in which you request a list of stamps on the topic of Masonry. Unfortunately, the action you request is not as simple as it would appear on the surface. There might be many lists because there are many facets to the hobby of Masonic Philately. These many lists would most likely be very contraversial because the science of "Who was a Mason" is not precise - especially during the eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries. Any lists would be instantly out of date with the frequency of stamps being issued now-a-days and the Masonic association of many of them. Masonic Philately is very dynamic.


First, let me discuss the many categories of Masonic Philately. One can collect stamps issued for Masonic anniversaries such as Grand Lodges have done in many foreign countries. One can collect Masons pictured on stamps or stamps whose designs are associated with various Masons. One can collect Masonic symbols on stamps - as you can imagine this sub-topic is wide open to interpretation. One can collect covers.

Next, information on the Masonic membership of persons pictured on stamps has been a life-long project of many eminent individuals. Many Grand Lodges have Lodges dedicated to Masonic Research. There are many Philatelic groups devoted exclusively to the topic of Masonry - The Masonic Stamp Club of New York, The George Washington Masonic Stamp Club (Washington, D.C.), the Denver Masonic Stamp Club, The Temple Stamp Club of Milwaukee, The Masonic Study Unit of the American Topical Association as well as similar groups in The Netherlands, Great Britain, So. Australia, France, Italy and The Fhilippines. Many, many Masonic Philatelists are engaged in the generation of such a "list of stamps on the topic of Masonry" - each is different and is slanted foward an individual's or a group's outlook.

Several individuals have tried to publish lists or books of Masons on stamps but none are widely accepted as "the gospel". I published a booklet back in the early 1960's which is terribly out of date. Chris Murphy of Canada has published a book on the subject which is quite complete for the U.S. and Canada but contains data which is contested by several individuals. The MSA has copied much of this data in a ' booklet by Bro. Murphy they have sponsored. Many of the Masonic Philatelic organizations publish periodic newsletters which keep the hobby up to date as well as review older cases - specifically The Masonic Stamp Club of New York ("The Masonic Philatelist" - quarterly) The Masonic Study Unit ("The Philatelic Freemason" - bi-monthly), the Masonic Stamp Group of Great Britain (quarterly) and the Unit in The Netherlands. I am enclosing one of our recent Newsletters and an application form if you might be interested in joining and becoming an active participant in the hobby. NEW ZEALAND GRAND LODGE CENTENNIAL

The New Zealand Grand Lodge Centennial will be celebrated in November of this year and Masonic covers will be available to commemorate this event. These covers will be franked with a stamp depicting Sir Bernard Freyburg, a noted New Zealand Statesman and Freemason. He received his degrees in the Household Brigade No. 2614 which met at Prince's, Picadilly, on 27 Feb. 1922, 24 April 1923 and 30 April 1923. He later resigned from the Lodge on 23 Feb. 1931 and on 26 April 1946 became a joining member of the New Zealand Lodge No. 5175, London; he later became an Honorary Member. In New Zealand he became a joining member of the Westminister Lodge No. 308, Wellington, and in 1948 was installed its Worshipful Master.



Bro. Norman Lincoln has provided a strange "Cinderella" issue - an inspection stamp issued by the Indiana Board of Health, Sanitary Bedding Section. Across the center of the design is printed "FIAT LUX" Latin for "Let There Be Light". Does anyone know the significance behind this 'application? Of course, the Masonic Order cannot assume exclusive use of this Biblical phrase but there might be some connection. Bro. Lincoln has a couple more of these stamps for anyone that might be interested. His address is 107 1/2 Barron St., Eaton, OH 45320.

- Apr.6,1990 Brazil World Health Day 1 value depicts two hearts in test tube.
- Apr.24,1990 Hungary 400th Anniversary of the Bible 1 value/label
- May 2,1990 Cook Islands -150th Anniversary of Penny Black/Paintings - 4 values and S/S - \$1.85 value is "Portrait of a Gentleman" by Albrecht Durer.
- May 6,1990 Colombia 150th Anniversary Death Anniversary of Gen. Franscisco de Paula Santander - 5 values.
- May 10,1990 Marshall Islands World War II/50th Anniversary of Winston Churchill's Election as Prime Minister - 1 value






A MEMBER'S PAGE
