

MASONIC ISSUE FROM FRANCE

Bro. Jean Claude Vilespy has informed us of the latest Masonic release from France. Released on June 28, 2003, it commemorates the 275th Anniversary of Freemasonry in France, Bro. Vilespy also provided a copy of the various philatelic products offered by "La Poste". (Oh, that the USPS might adopt similar practices.)



The Presentation Sheet offers an explanation of the history and evolution of French Freemasonry. It traces its existence back to the 17th Century in Great Britain when it evolved from an ancient trade organization into a new social group. The first Lodges appeared in Paris in the year 1720 and the foundation of French Freemasonry was established with the election of the Duke of Wharton as Grand Master in 1728.

Bro. Williams, 78, was a retiree of GTE, a US Navy Veteran of World War II and a 50 year member and Past Master of Sylvania Lodge No. 354. He served in several elected positions within the upper bodies and had received several awards. He had been married for 53 years.

Incidentally, Bro. Longenecker went back into the hospital on Aug. 28 for another knee replacement – to resolve the septic condition he developed a couple of months ago. We all hope it works out well, Bro. Stan. My septic hip situation now seems to be a thing of the past.

Bro. James G. Dougherty, PO Box 1192, Austin, TX, would like to correspond with anyone who might shed more light on a couple of cachet areas he is working on: 1. President and Brother Franklin D. Roosevelt's naval cruise cachets and cancellations, and 2. civic events during the 1932 George Washington Bicentennial. Regarding the first topic, he states that beginning with the New York Naval Review of 1934, FDR made numerous trips on US naval vessels. There does not seem to be a comprehensive list of ships and cancels and he hopes to be able to fill that void. Bro. Dougherty recently attended his son's graduation from Marine Corps Recruit Depot and prepared a cover for the event - despite problems encountered when the clerk was not aware of the USPS "hand back" procedures.

Bro. Roy Schwartz and his family had a pleasant surprise when the USPS issued the sheet of stamps honoring photographers. The stamp for Lewis W. Hine (1874-1940) pictures the family of Giovanni Gustozzo waiting at Ellis Island for him to take them home to Scranton, PA, to start a new life. They had traveled for 40 days from the small village of Santa Margherita in Agrigento province on the island of Sicily to Ellis Island. They had processed through the U.S. Customs and were found acceptable to enter as emigrants to America when Hine took this picture. Anna Gustozzo was holding her one year old son, Dominick; her son Paul holds the hand of a daughter, Mary. The suitcase and sack contained all their worldly possessions. They were waiting for Giovanni to arrive from Scranton who was painfully late.

Giovanni did arrive and the family did settle in Scranton. The baby Dominick grew up, and married and, in 1928, when his daughter was born, he named her Anna. When Anna grew up she married Bro. Roy Schwartz thereby enabling him to be able to say "my father-in-law is on this United States postage stamp!!!"

BRAZIL STAMP CATALOG 2003



This 17 X 25 cm book sells for US\$26 plus postage costs of US\$4 (economy registered mail), US\$6 (priority registered mail) or US\$13 (express mail). BUDDY EBSEN



Buddy Ebsen, best known as Jed Clampett on the television series *The Beverly Hillbillies*, died on July 6, 2003, at Torrance Memorial Medical Center in Torrance, California. He had been hospitalized near his home in Palos Verdes Estates for several weeks. His wife, six children and six grandchildren were by his side at the time of his death. He was born Christian Ebsen, Jr., in 1908 in Belleville, Illinois.

Buddy Ebsen was initiated into John M. Cheney Chapter DeMolay in Orlando, FL, in 1926. He was inducted into the DeMolay Hall of Fame on June 21, 1996.

Surprisingly, he had not planned on becoming an actor. He was studying to become a doctor and had completed two years of pre-med studies at the University of Florida and Rollins College. Then the Florida land boom collapsed, his family lost a lot of money and medical school was no longer a possibility.


Since Buddy's father was a dance teacher, all his children learned to dance. With that experience, Ebsen went to New York to try show business. On Broadway his credits include "Whoopee" 1928, "Flying Colors" 1933, "Ziegfield" Follies 1934, "Yokel Boy" 1939, "Showboat" 1945 and "Male Animal" 1953. His next venture was the movies. His principle film credits include "Broadway Melody of 1935" with his dancing partner and sister, Vilma, "Broadway Melody of 1938" with Judy Garland, "Born to Dance", the Shirley Temple picture "Captain January", "Banjo on my Knee", "Lucky Star", "Mail Order Bride" and "Breakfast at Tiffany's".

In 1962, while in his mid-fifties, Ebsen became a star when he was chosen to portray Jed Clampett in the television series *TheBeverly Hillbillies*. After the series ended, he had several movie roles and television guest roles before landing the title role in *Barnaby Jones*. After retiring from acting, he became a folk artist, painting landscapes, seascapes and self portraits. In 2001 he began writing, publishing a romance called "Kelly's Quest" that became a bestseller and "The Other Side of Oz".


Ebsen continued to play a part in DeMolay, even after his time as an active DeMolay. He was present at a Southern California DeMolay function in 1995. At the time of his induction into the DeMolay Hall of Fame, he credited the organization with much of the influence on his life.


NEW MASONIC COVER FROM THE GWMSC


MASONIC CANCEL FOR FLORALA CELEBRATION

CLOUD – CUCKOO - LAND USPS RELEASES FOR 2004

Bro. Norm Lincoln has sent in his annual survey of the USPS stamp program for next year. In case you are wondering about the title, it refers to a pane of 15 different "cloudscapes" to be issued in September. Of all the foolish issues ever made, this has to be at or near the worst. Possibly Joni Mitchell fans may like them (Both Sides Now) or Johnny Ray afficionados (The Little White Cloud That Cried). Classical scholars will recognize the quotation from Aristophanes comedy "The Birds". Avian topicalists may rejoice. Most of us will just shake our heads and mutter in disgust.

I was able to find only one new Masonic connection, plus five which have previously been profiled in this journal. Starting with the latter we find Agnes Demille, the famous choreographer, who was not a Mason but her father William (1878-1955) and her uncle Cecil (1881-1959 were both members of Prince of Orange No. 16, NY, and Henry S. Orme No 458, CA. They were renowned as actors, dramatists and film directors.

If anyone knows of a Masonic connection for Dr. Seuss, George Balanchine, Martha Graham, Alvin Ailey, Isamu Noguchi, R. Buckmaster Fuller, James Baldwin, Martin Johnson Heade, Moss Hart or Wilma Rudolph, I'm sure our editor would be happy. While Spencer Tracy, a staunch Catholic, was not a Mason, it is high time he was honored by a stamp. No film actor, with the possible exception of Frederic March, had a more distinguished career. (We are not forgetting Lawrence Olivier, John Mills, Ralph Richardson and other English stars who were not American)

The "Art of Disney" honors Walt the creator who was a DeMolay. We should not forget that the business manager of the Disney empire was Walt's brother Roy who was a Mason. Paul Robeson was on Guyana 2678g though his name was misspelled. Maybe it was for EFO collectors. Meriwether Lewis and William Clark first appeared on a stamp in 1954 (US Scott 1063). Their images were based on sculptures by Bro. William Keck.

The only new Masonic related tamp is the one honoring Henry Mancini who was not a Mason. The artwork includes the Pink Panther for which Henry Mancini wrote the music. The creator of "The Pink Panther" was Friz Freleng.

ISADORE "FRIZ" FRELENG

Isadore "Friz" Freleng was born Aug. 21, 1906, in Kansas City. He became a cartoonist and created most of the famed Warner Brothers creatures. Producer Brother Leon Schlesinger let Freleng direct and he responded with 12 Academy Award nominations. Five were for Oscar winners: "Tweety Pie" 1947, "Speedy Gonzalez" 1955, Bird Anonymous" 1957, "Knghty Knight, Bugs" 1958 and "The Pink Phink" 1964. Voice characterizations by Bro. Mel Blanc helped immeasurably, although the Pink Panther didn't talk. Friz died May 26, 1995. My records indicate he was a member of Los Angeles Lodge No. 42, CA, and a Shriner.

PELHAM GREVILLE WODEHOUSE


Pelham G. Wodehouse was born in Guilford, Surrey, Oct. 15, 1881 and attended Dulwich College. He was a columnist for the Globe from 1903-1909. Then he became a critic for Vanity Fair. He collaborated with Bro. Jerome Kern on the musical "Miss Springtime" 1916 which was a success. "Have a Heart", "Oh, Boy!" and "Leave it to Jane" all 1917 were also hits. "Sally" starred Marilyn Miller and gave us "Look for the Silver Lining". Wodehouse continued writing lyrics as well as novels. "A Damsel in Distress" 1919 was made into a film with Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers with music by George and Ira Gershwin. With "A Man of Leisure" 1923 he created Bertie Wooster and his man Jeeves. He wrote "Bill" for Helen Morgan in "Show Boat" and "March of the Musketeers" for Dennis King in "The Three Musketeers" with music by Rudolph Friml. Hs autobiography "Perforning Flea" was published in 1953. MGM managed to omit him completely from their Jerome Kern biography "Till the Clouds Roll By" 1946. He wrote the screenplay for "Anything Goes" 1956.

Bro. Wodehouse was a member of Jerusalem Lodge No. 197, United Grand Lodge of England. Jerome Kern is on Scott No. 1010 and Show Boat is on Scott No. 2767.

FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA

In September 1925, four members of the faculty of Virginia Polytechnic Institute located at Blacksburg, Virginia, were discussing agriculture students. They decided such students should have an organization for self-expression and pride in their farm background. Out of this grew the Future Farmers of America. The four founders were all Masons.

Walter S. Newman was raised in Purdie Lodge No. 170, Windsor, VA in 1925 Edmond C. McGill was raised in Albert Pike Lodge No. 303, Wichita, KS and demitted to Hunters Lodge No. 156, Blacksburg, VA

H. W. Sanders was a member of Glen Allen Lodge No. 131, Glen Allen, VA and Tuckahoe Lodge No. 347, Richmond, VA


Henry C. Groseclose Sr., was raised in Ivanhoe Lodge No. 235, Wytheville, VA




A stamp honoring the FFA was issued Oct. 13, 1953 at Kansas City, MO – Scott No. 1024

NEW ISSUES

The following new issues applicable to a Masonic collection have been reported in the Philatelic press:

June 10, 2003 – Marshall Islands – Aviation 100th Anniversary, 10 se-tenant stamps. The Spirit of St. Louis is included.

June 17 – St. Kitts – Teddy Bear 100th Anniversary, pane of four stamps and a souvenir sheet. The Teddy Roosevelt Bear, the George Washington Bear and the Buffalo Bill Bear are included.

June 28 - France - French Freemasonry, one value

August 30 – France – Famous People/Characters of 19th Century Literature, six stamps and a souvenir sheet which combines the six stamps. Victor Hugo and Alexander Dumas are included.

Sept. 1 - Monaco - 75th Anniversary of Alexander Fleming's Discovery of Penicillin, one stamp

FRANTISEK (FRANS) KRIZIK

Born June 25, 1847, Frans Krizik became an electronic engineer and received an honorary Doctorate. Together with the Austrian Engineer, Ludwig Piette, he invented the automatic regulator for the Arc-lamp, the so-called "Plzn lamp". In 1881 this lamp earned a Gold Medal at the Electric Exhibit in Paris. In 1891 in Prague he designed the first electric automobile. Further, his design of the electric tram was shown at the Second Jubilee Exposition at Prague in 1891. There he introduced eight trams, driving from the Letna Hill to the Exhibition within 5 minutes. Unfortunately, the authorities refused to allow the trams to operate on the streets of Prague. In the small town of Liben, later a part of Prague, the layout was practicable for the trams and they became operational in 1892. The bureaucracy resulted in this system being discontinued in 1896. In 1899 he built the town power station of Pilzen and introduced the electric tram from Bory to Lochotin. He died in 1941 but can be remembered by a Krizik Fountain which had been erected during an early Exhibition, a memorial statue located in Pilzen near where he worked, the Krizik Gardens in Pilzen and many of his creations which are in the National Technical Museum of Prague.

Frantisek Krizik was a member of the Lodge "Sibi et Posteris" in Prague. He was honored by the Ceska Republic on June 25 1997, by the issuance of a stamp to commemorate his 150th birthday.




