

## MASONIC STAMP FROM ITALY DOES IT OR DOES IT NOT EXIST?

Your Editor and Bro. Maurice Beazley of the Masonic Philatelic Club (of Great Britain) have both seen an illustration of another Pure Masonic issue – this time from the country of Italy. Masonry is quite active in that country and there are at least two groups of Masonic Philatelists. One could imagine, however that there might be strong religious pressure against the issuance of a stamp for the Fraternity. It is not like the Latin American countries where Catholicism is the predominant religion but Freemasonry is also very strong in its own right. The release we have seen is shown here – but its existence has been denied by the Italian Stamp Bureau, the Italian Grand Lodge and several Italian stamp dealers. Can any member help solve this puzzle? Is the stamp real? Is it a privately printed label? Whatever the answer, one must admit that it would make a nice addition to a collection.

His service during the Gettysburg Campaign included defending an area within three miles of Bro. Brommer's home in Mechanicsburg, PA.

Bro. Charles A Orlick received a 50-Year Member Pin from his Lodge, East Gate Lodge #216, Cumberland, MD; he is a Past Master of that Lodge.



## **RECENT MASONIC CACHETED COVER ISSUES**


## GWMSC

# COUNT MICHAIL MICHAJLOVITSJ SPERANSKY

Born January 12, 1772, in Tsjerkoetino, Gouv. Vladimir in Russia, Michail M. Speransky was the son of a priest in a small village. He was appointed as a civil servant and soon became the most important consultant of Bro. Tsar Alexander I. He strove to improve the condition of the state finances and in doing so introduced an income tax on the nobility. After succeeding in this reform of the finances, he reorganized the form of the government creating new laws and a Constitution patterned after the French model. In 1806 he accompanied Alexander I to a conference with Napoleon Bonaparte in Erfurt, Prussia. Later, Napoleon stated that Speransky was the only person in Russia with a cool, great mind.

His actions caused a lot of commotion in the nobility and among the officials and just before Napoleon invaded Russia, Speransky was accused of making secret arrangements with France. He was banished to Nisjin Novgorod by Alexander in 1812. In 1816 he returned to Russia and was appointed governor of Penza and served as governor of Siberia from 1819 to 1821. He returned to St. Petersburg in 1821 but found he could no longer influence the Tsar. During the reign of Nicholas I, he was responsible for the definitive version of the Russian Laws developed in 1833. He died in St. Petersburg on February 23, 1839.

Bro. Speransky was initiated in 1809 in Lodge Poolster (Fesslers Lodge) in a secret meeting, probably initiated by the intercession of Tsar Alexander I. He was a member of this Lodge from 1809 to 1810 and also belonged to the Lodge "Volk van God". Later he was a member of a governmental commission to oversee the political stature of all Masonic Lodges in Russia. He was also a member of the commission for Dekabrists affairs and in the Commission "the 6<sup>th</sup> of December 1826".


## **HEINRICH HOFFMAN**

In the article on Heinrich Hoffman included in the previous Newsletter, I left out what is probably the most important part - his Masonic affiliation. This oversight was pointed out by several readers - my apologies.

Bro. Hoffman was initiated in 1836 in the Lodge "Zur Einigkeit" in Frankfurt, Germany.

#### MILTON CONRAD SCHMIDT

Bro. Peter Westbere informed us that Milt Schmidt was pictured on one of the hockey player stamps issued by Canada in 2004. He played for and was associated with the Boston Bruins from 1936 to 1973 being elected to the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1961. He was born in Kitchener, Ontario, Canada, on March 5, 1918. He is presently living in Mässachusetts and Bro. Westbere was able to secure his autograph on a FDC of the hockey stamp which pictures him.



Bro. Schmidt received his degrees in 1954 in Fraternity Lodge which later merged with Fuller Lodge. (Unfortunately, I have not been able to determine the town/city in which this Lodge was located – it is not listed in the book of current Lodges.) He was initiated on May 21, passed on June 18 and raised on September 10 – all in 1954. He demitted from the Fraternity on August 31, 1987.

## **OSCAR PETERSON**


While we are discussing Canadian stamps, we must note that Bro. Norman Lincoln has pointed out that Canada will be honoring Bro. Oscar Emmanuel Peterson on his birthday – August 25. Born in Montreal, Quebec, Canada in 1925 he started studying piano at the age of five. In 1945 he began his recording career with RCA Victor; his idol was Art Tatum. He made more than 80 albums. In 1947 he formed a trio and began weekly radio broadcasts. Jazz promoter Norman Granz heard him in 1949, brought him to Carnegie Hall and made him part of the "Jazz at the Philharmonic" series. In 1952 Barney Kessel1, guitar, and Ray Brown, bass, joined him for a memorable trio. Herb Ellis replaced Kessell and drummer Ed Thigpen replaced Ellis. In 1968 Peterson began a series of solo piano recordings. He received seven Grammy awards between 1974 and 1991. He received Canada's highest award: Companion of the Order of Canada and was considered the greatest living jazz pianist. His phenomenal technique was affected by a stroke he suffered in 1993. He was named to the Big Band and Jazz Hall of Fame in 1995.

The Canadian Encyclopedia states that he is a Mason. Can any of our Canadian members help fill in his Masonic biography?



## INTERESTING BOURSE ACQUISITIONS

New Masonic acquisitions are getting harder and harder to find at stamp shows – at least at reasonable prices. Last weekend I stopped in at the Philatelic Show 2005 held in Boxborough, MA and "got lucky". After viewing a hand drawn and hand colored Civil War Patriotic Cover which included the Masonic emblem in the design available for \$400 and a copy of Scott 113 with a nice Masonic Cancel, off cover, available for \$200, I stopped at a booth to browse through a box of Massachusetts and Maine covers. The search was rewarded with this North Adams, MA cover with a lovely Masonic cork cancel for the "downto-earth" price of \$7.50. I had asked the dealer if he had any Masonic material and he looked at me as if I had three heads. I almost felt guilty.

## NICK KOUTROULIS' LAST TWO COVERS

When Bro. Nick Koutroulis closed out his tenure as Editor of "The Masonic Stamp Collector" in 1975, his last few issues were sporadically spaced. -4/2/74, 7/30/74, 1/23/75 and 2/15/75. He stated in the 1/23/75 issue, Vol. 7, No. 1, that the last Masonic cover issued was No. 38 honoring Skylab and Bro. Paul Weitz. He also stated that there may be two or three more. This was the last issue and he later stated in a letter to me that his business pressures and a move from Louisiana to Texas forced him to drop the MSU activities.

I tried several times to contact Bro. Nick after that date, without success. A few years later, I saw an article in Linn's which stated that he had served as a judge at the annual ATA convention. The letter prompted by that news was answered and he explained about the business pressures and the move. He also sent along a copy of his cover No. 39 and explained that it had not been sold or distributed because all the MSU material got lost or misplaced during the move to Texas.

Recently, T. L. Qualls of The Woodlands, TX, has been offering a lot of Nick's MSU Cover material on eBay. I contacted him and explained my interest and he informed me that he had acquired a portion of Nick's stock at a Regency auction. More recently, he as been offering copies of Nick's covers #39 and #40 – for Haym Salomon and David W. Griffith – created in March and May 1975. He states that these were not commonly available – confirming what one can derive from the Newsletters. I was able to procure a few sets of these two covers and would be willing to pass them on at a cost of \$4.00 each.



## ANTONIO VINCENTE FELIPPE CELESTINO

Antonio Celestino was born September 12, 1894 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. When he was eight years old he had already started on an artistic career. He had an extraordinary beautiful voice and often sang in churches and clubs as part of national feasts and celebrations. He did not seek payment for these appearances but did receive many compliments, free refreshments and lots of applause, His idol was Enrico Caruso and his repertoire included many opera roles as well as waltzes and sacred music.

He turned professional at the age of 20 in the Sao Jose Theater where he sang his famous song "Flor do mal" (Flower of the evil). This song was recorded in 1916 and several thousand copies were made – but all he received was 10,000 reis. He also appeared in movies, composing his own songs for those appearances as well. He was invited to go to Europe to sing but he never wanted to leave his beloved Brazil. He sang for 65 years and was called "The proud of Brazil". His last performance was in the afternoon of August 23, 1968 in Sao Paulo in front of 200 people. That evening he died and his last words were "Please, don't let me die".

Bro. Celestino was featured on a Masonic First Day Cover for the Brazilian stamp issued on September 12, 1994 to honor his 100<sup>th</sup> birthday. Unfortunately, no details on his Masonic membership are offered. Perhaps our Brazilian Brethren can help us with this information.






# HERMAN WILLEM DAENDELS

Herman Daendels was born in 1762 in Hattem, Netherlands, son of the magistrate of that city. He went to Latin School in Deventer and studied Law at the High School (University) in Harderwijk. He was banished from the country in 1786 because of his resistance to the Stadtholder, William V. He married and went to French Flanders where he became an arms manufacturer. He became a lieutenant colonel in the foreign legion and went With Pichegru and the French Army to Holland to help establish the Batavian Republic. He became Commander in Chief of the Batavian Army and tried to get Holland a top rank in World politics. He was unsuccessful and retired to try to build a charitable institution at his county seat "De Dellen" near Heerde, Holland.

King Louis Napoleon made him governor-general of the Dutch East Indies. He served like a dictator and was instructed to build the Jahn Pos, the most important East-West connection at Java (the entire population worked there as convicts). In the Indies, all the Lodges were closed and he was afraid of a plot against him. After some time he returned to Europe and followed Napoleon to Russia. He died of yellow fever on May 2, 1818 at St. George d'Elmina, Ghana.

Bro. Daendels was initiated in Lodge Le Profond Silence in Kampen on October 7, 1785. There have been no stamps issued yet picturing Bro. Daendels but he was honored by a cover published by "De Getande Rand".
