


JOSEPHA. WALKES, JR.

It is with sorrow that we announce the passing of Bro. Joseph A. Walkes, Jr., of Fort Leavenworth, Kansas on March 4, 2006. Although his family came from Barbados, he was born in New York City on November 12, 1933. He served in the U.S. Army from 1951, retiring in 1973. He was raised Oct. 15, 1956 in Cecil A. Ellis Lodge No. 110 PHA MD Karlsruhe, Germany and served as Master of that Lodge in 1966-67. He later became a member of King Solomon Lodge No. 15 PHA MO and Kansas City Consistory No. 7. He was coroneted 33rd Degree in Los Angeles in August 1978. He also belonged to Allah Temple No. 6 A.E.A.O.N.M.S and Fidelity Chapter No. 9, O.E.S. of Leavenworth, KS being a Past Patron. Bro. Walkes belonged to the Church of the Latter Day Saints.

Bro. Walkes founded The Phylaxis Society in 1973 – a "Society of Prince Hall Freemasons who seek more Light and have Light to Impart" – and served many years as the President, later as President Emeritus. Along with the late Allen Roberts, they fought successfully for recognition of Prince Hall Masonry by the mainstream Grand Lodges.



He wrote Black Square and Compasses" in 1979 and was the author of several other publications dealing with Prince Hall Masonry; he was recognized as a leading authority on that branch of Freemasonry.

Bro. Walkes was a member of the Masonic Study Unit for many years and contributed a significant amount of information for publication. He served as Vice President for a few years -I always enjoyed my correspondence with him. We extend our condolences to his widow, Jeanette, two daughters, Wenonah and Jacqueline and two sons, Joseph III and Michael.

ANOTHER PURE MASONIC ISSUE BEING ISSUED


Brother Henk Godthelp, Editor of the Verlichte Loep, informs us that the Netherlands will be issuing a Pure Masonic stamp on June 6, 2006. On that day a block of 10 stamps will be issued, two of which have Masonic significance. The Pure Masonic stamp celebrates 250 years of the Dutch Grand Lodge named "Het Grootoosten der Nederlanden". The set also includes stamps which picture Elvis Presley, Sesame Street, regional languages and Multatulie (Max Havelaar). Multatulie was the pseudonym of Bro. Eduard Douwes Dekkar – a Freemason. His particulars have been cited in a previous Newsletter (page 620 back in the late 1980s). I will repeat the details in a forthcoming Newsletter for those whose file does not go back that far.

THE MASONIC PHILATELIC CLUB (of GREAT BRITAIN) 30th ANNIVERSARY

The Masonic Philatelic Club of Great Britain has published a commemorative Masonic cover to note their 30th Anniversary this year. AN INTERESTING ACQUISITION – IT TOOK 18 YEARS

Back in the second half of the 1970s, I undertook the task of trying to compile a Catalog of Masonic Cacheted Covers. I had acquired a significant number of them and thought I had a good handle on the situation -I was way off. Through the assistance of several noted Masonic cover collectors, including Stan Longenecker, Mo Nafzinger, John Allen, Dave Pritchard, Edsel Hatfield and Dick Needham, I was able to develop a credible catalog which proved to be acceptable to many fellow collectors. (I still have some copies but they are woeffully inadequate by today's status.) Each contributor was able to provide clear copies of those covers which I did not own for illustration in the catalog. I was able to establish long standing correspondence relationships with most of these "helpers" – some of which still continue today. Through the cover collecting efforts and the MSU/ATA, I was able to establish a strong correspondence tie with Bro. Dick Needham. We wrote often and I helped him acquire covers for his cachets when he was suffering from cancer – he beat it once then it came back to beat him. Near the end in 1988 he told me that he had sent his cover collection for appraisal/sale but kept his collection of Mahdeen's - bis creations (Needham spelled backwards). Shortly after his passing, I wrote to his widow to see if I might be of some help in assessing/disposing of his residual collection. She said she was getting it appraised. Subsequent letters were unanswered.

Fast-forward to November 2004. An individual in Ohio wrote to me through the AASR (NJ) office, in conjunction with my article "The Stamp Act" which appears in their magazine, "Northern Light", to ask if I were a collector and if I would appraise a collection for him. I responded in the affirmative but heard no response. Just over two weeks ago my wife and I returned home from a lunch "out" to find a large box by our back door. I opened it up to find the three albums containing Bro. Dick Needham's personal collection of Mahdeen FDCs and a fourth album of FDCs done by others. It appears that the wife of the collector who wrote to me in 2004 is the niece of Dick Needham's widow (she is now in a nursing home). He had misplaced my letter and when he found it this month, he procrastinated no longer and just mailed the collection. We have had some good conversations and I am in the process of disposing of the covers for him – after, of course, I acquire the ones I was missing. Consequently, if any member is interested in a priced inventory of the 411 covers available for sale, please contact me for a copy of it – either by e-mail (EXCEL format) or USPS mail. If you would like a copy of the inventory of Masonic Cacheted Covers which I have in my stock for sale, please request that also. It was interesting to learn that Dick issued seven FDCs before he issued his first Masonic FDC – for the Freedom Statue, Scott 989 on April 20, 1950. He did a non-Masonic cachet for Samuel Gompers and six cachets in 1948 and 1949 under the name of "Phil Ately". My contact is trying to locate the "Special events" album for me.



I have maintained an inventory for my Masonic covers stock and some of my non-Masonic covers but not all the stamps – both Masonic and non-in nature - which I have amassed in addition to my basic collection. 


FDC FOR AUSTRIAN PURE MASONIC ISSSUE

ANTI-MASON – POPE LEO XII

Pope Leo XII, whose birth name was Annibale Francesco del'la Genga, was born in 1760. He held various high church officers during the Napoleonic era (1793-1823), was made a Cardinal in 1816 and served as Pope from 1823 to his death in 1829. He issued the Bull against Freemasons on March 13, 1825 known as "Quo graviora mala".

Here is a particularly pertinent section wherein he describes his concerns about Masons:


"Then come their doctrines of politics, in which the naturalists lay down that all menhave the same right, and are in every respect of equal and like condition; that each one is naturally free; that no one has the right to command another; that it is an act of violence to require men to obey any authority other than that which is obtained from themselves. According to this, therefore, all things belong to the free people; power is held by the command or permission of the people, so that when the popular will changes, rulers may lawfully be deposed and the source of all rights and civil duties is either in the multitude or in the governing authority when this is constituted according to the latest doctrines. It is also held that the State should be without God; that in the various forms of religion there is no reason why one should have precedence of another; and they are all to occupy the same place."

SUGAR RAY ROBINSON

The USPS issued a stamp on April 7, 2006 to honor Walker Smith, better known today as Sugar Ray Robinson.. He was bom in Detroit, MI in 1921 and during the 1940 and 1950 decades he dominated boxing like no one else. He was nicknamed "Sugar" for his sweet as-sugar style of fighting and originally borrowed the identity of a friend named Ray Robinson in order to enter an amateur boxing tournament for which he was under the required age. He was known for his flashy pink Cadillac which he sported all over New York City and for the fact that he remained independent – refusing to do business with organized crime and conducting negotiations for many of his on fights by himself. He retired from the ring for the last time in 1965 and along the way had defeated a list of champions and near-champions that reads like a roll-call of the Boxing Hall of Fame. He died in 1989.




Bro. Sugar Ray Robinson was a member of Joppa Lodge No. 55 Prince Hall Affiliation, New York City. The cover shown here was produced by JUNCTION CACHETS and was offered on eBay (2 copies only) by Jim Taylor of Havre de Grace, MD. (I believe he was the producer.)

JEAN MACE

Bro. Jean-Claude Vilespy has forwarded a copy of a card/cover prepared for Jean Mace. The special cancel used on January 24, 2004, recognized the Inauguration of the "Mediatheque Jean Mace". Jean Mace was born August 22, 1815 in Paris. He was an excellent student and achieved his bachelor of letters degree at the age of 20. He became active in public life and spent several periods in exile as a result of disagreements with the ruling regime. Known as a Senator he is remembered for having founded the League of Education (or Instruction). In 1864 he, with Hetzel and Jules Verne, founded the Journal "Le Magasin d'Education et de Recreation". He died in 1894 in Monthiers.

Bro. Mace was initiated June 2, 1866 in the Lodge "La Parfaite Harmonie" of the "Oriente de Mulhouse".




MASONIC ALLEGORIES IN THE CUBAN FLAG

Pres. Bro. Gene Fricks has forwarded an article found in "The Cuban Philatelist", First Third 2004 concerning Ladies in the Stamps of the Republic by Silvia Garcia-Frutos. The section discussing Emilia Teurbe Tolon cites:


"In the set commemorating the Centennial of the Flag [July 3, 1951] she appears on the 5c stamp sewing the very first flag designed by her husband Miguel Teurbe-Tolon as encouraged by Narcisco Lopez, while they met with other Cubans, including Cirilo Villaverde, in June 1849 in New York.

"It must be added that the Cuban flag is replete of Masonic symbolism. Narcisco Lopez, its creator, had been president [sic] of the Tayaba Lodge together with Jose I. Armenteros, and had also belonged to other Lodges in the United States. These are the messages on our ensign: the triangle and the number 7 transmit the universal Masonic message and its ideals of fraternity, equality, freedom, beauty, purity, fortitude and heroism."

MELVILLE LOUIS KOSSUTH DEWEY



An "add-on" Masonic cacheted cover recently offered on eBay features Melvil Dewey and identifies him as a Mason. In a response to my question, Maria Hebert, the creator of the "addon" operating as Mh Cachets stated that she found his name listed as a Mason on one of the sites she found by "googling" "Famous Masons". I have not yet been able to research his Masonic background – can any member help in this quest?

Melville Louis Kossuth Dewey was born Dec. 10, 1851, to a pcor family living in a small town in northern New York. As a child he felt drawn to mathematics and enjoyed playing around with classification systems. His family could not afford to send him to college and he waited until he was 19 to attend Amherst College, working in the college library to help fund his education. He remained as a librarian following graduation in 1874 and worked towards improving library classification systems. He devised a system of Arabic numbers and decimals to categorize books according to subject rather than a dedicated spot on the shelf. Amherst published his system in a pamphlet entitled *A Classification* and Subject Index for Cataloguing and Arranging the Books and Pamphlets of a Library, now in its 21st edition and contained in four volumes.

In 1876 Dewey moved to Boston where he founded the Library Bureau, a library supply company. He was also a founding member of the American Library Association serving as secretary and president. In 1883 he became a librarian at Columbia College and started a library school. His last professional library position was that of director of the New York State library. In 1894 he and his wife started an exclusive resort in upstate New York but ran into some discrimination problems leaving that venture in 1905. He dabbled in real estate developing many retirement resorts in New York and Florida and died on Dec. 26, 1931. The US stamp issued on July 13, 1982, Scott 2015, for libraries could be used for this case.



RICHARD PRYOR


Richard Franklin Lennox Thomas Pryor III was born in Peoria, IL on Dec. 1, 1940. At the age of 7 he was playing drums and at 12 began an acting career. He became a successful night club comedian using material of questionable taste. His film and television appearances were mixed farce and drama. A series of hit comedies and concert films in the '70s and '80s helped make him one of the highest paid stars in Hollywood. Throughout his life he battled personal issues – drug and alcohol addictions and later Multiple Sclerosis. He received the Hall of Fame award at the NAACP 27th Image Awards in 1996 and in 1998 he was awarded the first Mark Twain Prize for humor by The John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington. He was married six times. In 1995 he said: "I had some great things and I had some bad things. The best and the worst. In other words, I had a life." He died of a heart attack on Dec. 10, 2005 at the age of 65 after having been ill with multiple sclerosis for several years.

Bro. Richard Pryor was a member of Henry Brown Lodge No. 22 PHA, Peoria, IL, the Scottish Rite and the Shrine. On March 25, 1993, The Gambia issued a set of "Baseball Film" stamps which show several films and their related actors. One stamp, Scott 1348h, commemorates "Brewster's Millions" and pictures Bro. Richard Pryor.
